Tony said he did not know what was going on but he will call and talk to Bob and see if this can be taken out of the system but not completely. Chief Yuodis said he would let him handle this. Jack Miller stated when he went to put in a run he noticed there was another number skipped, he called and talked to a dispatcher and she told him it said test do not dispatch but it created a number. Discussion followed.

Chief Yuodis talked about the radio system and a way to advise volunteers when a run was cleared. He sated Rich Carlson put out a memo on having a new scanner. Chief Yuodis wanted Tony Downes to look into a FEMA grant to buy all volunteers a scanner and since our cap is 50 people use that number for how many scanners we want. Jack Miller wanted to know about using the old pagers for the volunteers so they know when to slow down on a run. Tony stated the solution for us right now would be to reprogram our radios to D for scan and have fire 2 and who ever cancels get on the radio and inform everyone. Discussion followed.

Chief Yuodis asked Jake Barker is anyone showed him how to put his radio on scan. Jake stated yes Rick told him a couple of ways to do this.

Chief Yuodis reported the paving project at the academy is underway and should be done the end of this week or the first of next week.

Tony Downes reported Mike Schmidt sent out a letter a few months ago about fires in Fern Creek, it is a working fire you can send a 2nd or 3rd piece. Discussion followed.
